

A COVID-19 Day in the Life of a Pre K-K Student

1. Student attends school when non-symptomatic.
2. Parent walks to the west entrance with student. Parent and student walk 6 feet away from others while wearing a face covering indoors.
3. Student and parent stand in line to have student's temperature checked.
4. If temperature is 100.4 degrees or above, student receives books needed, returns home and completes work remotely until no longer symptomatic.
5. If temperature is 100.3 degrees or lower, student walks to class with mask on, keeping 6 feet of distance.
6. If parent desires to walk student into class, his/her temperature must be taken and he/she must wear a face covering.
7. Upon entering the class, student may take off the face covering.
8. Student will follow the CDC Washing Hands guidelines before lunch and will wash hands or use hand sanitizer before and after recesses/PE.
9. If a student feels sick or becomes symptomatic, he/she will be sent to the office with a face covering on. Student will wait while books are collected to complete remote instruction and for parent to arrive.
10. Sick and/or symptomatic students will be sent home as soon as possible.
11. Sick and/or symptomatic students will remain at home and practice distance learning until they are no longer symptomatic.
12. Students with a positive COVID-19 test will remain at home until they are no longer symptomatic.
13. At the end of the day, parent will enter west doors with a face covering to pick up student.

A COVID-19 Day in the Life of a 1st-2nd Grade Student

1. Student attends school when non-symptomatic.
2. Parent walks to the main entrance with student. Parent and student walk 6 feet away from others while wearing a face covering indoors.
3. Student and parent stand in line to have student's temperature checked.
4. If temperature is 100.4 degrees or above, student receives books needed, returns home and completes work remotely until no longer symptomatic.
5. If temperature is 100.3 degrees or lower, student walks to class with mask on, keeping 6 feet of distance.
6. If parent desires to walk student into class, his/her temperature must be taken and he/she must wear a face covering.
7. Upon entering the class, student may take off the face covering.
8. Student will follow the CDC Washing Hands guidelines before lunch and will wash hands or use hand sanitizer before and after recesses/PE.
9. If a student feels sick or becomes symptomatic, he/she will be sent to the office with a face covering on. Student will wait while books are collected to complete remote instruction and for parent to arrive.
10. Sick and/or symptomatic students will be sent home as soon as possible.
11. Sick and/or symptomatic students will remain at home and practice distance learning until they are no longer symptomatic.
12. Students with a positive COVID-19 test will remain at home until they are no longer symptomatic.
13. At the end of the day, students will meet parents for pick up. First grade meets parents on the west side and second grade meets parents outside classroom door.

A COVID-19 Day in the Life of a 3rd-6th Grade Student

1. Student attends school when non-symptomatic.
2. Student walks to the main entrance. Student walks 6 feet away from others while wearing a face covering indoors.
3. Student stands in line to have temperature checked.
4. If temperature is 100.4 degrees or above, student receives books needed, returns home and completes work remotely.
5. If temperature is 100.3 degrees or lower, student walks to class with face covering on, keeping 6 feet of distance.
6. If a parent desires to walk the student to class the first week of school, his/her temperature must be taken and he/she must wear a face covering.
7. Upon entering the class, student may take off the face covering.
8. Student will follow the CDC Washing Hands guidelines before lunch and will wash hands or use hand sanitizer before and after recesses/PE.
9. If a student feels sick or becomes symptomatic, he/she will be sent to the office with a face covering on. Student will wait while books are collected to complete remote instruction and for parent to arrive.
10. Sick and/or symptomatic students will be sent home as soon as possible.
11. Sick and/or symptomatic students will remain at home and practice distance learning until they are no longer symptomatic.
12. Students with a positive COVID-19 test will remain at home until they are no longer symptomatic.
13. At the end of the day, students will meet parents for pick up either on the west side (3rd, 5th) or outside the classroom door (4th, 6th).

A COVID-19 Day in the Life of a Secondary Student

The following is meant to provide a snapshot of what we anticipate a normal school day will look like for an HCS secondary student while COVID-19 mandates and safety measures are in place.

1. Student attends school when not symptomatic.
2. Student will enter the building wearing a mask.
3. Student will stand socially distanced in the designated line to have temperature checked.
4. Keeping mask on, students will go to their lockers to drop off/pick up materials, and then proceed directly to classroom.
5. Students will have the choice of leaving mask on or removing mask once in his/her desk (which will be distanced 6 ft or more from other desks).
6. Students will wear masks between classes in the hallway and maintain as much distance as possible.
7. Students will remain in one classroom while teachers rotate when possible.
8. Students will wash their hands in the restroom or using a classroom sink prior to leaving for lunch.
9. Students will stand distanced in the designated lunch line if buying his/her lunch.
10. During lunch period, students will sit with peers with whom they share classrooms and will be distanced from other students with whom they do not share classrooms normally.
11. Students will wash their hands in the restroom or using a classroom sink after returning from lunch.
12. If a student feels sick or evidences symptoms, he/she will be sent to the office in a mask and will remain in the designated sick room for assessment.
13. Sick and/or symptomatic students will be sent home as soon as possible.
14. Sick and/or symptomatic students will remain at home and practice distance learning until they are no longer symptomatic.
15. Students with a positive COVID-19 test will remain at home until they are no longer symptomatic.
