## Drivers Education Coming Up in April



Heritage Christian School is planning to offer a Driver Education class this spring. This class will be Montana Department of Justice certified and will meet all of Montana's requirements for Driver's Education. **We are tentatively scheduled to begin classes on Monday, April 25<sup>th</sup> with a mandatory parent/student meeting on Thursday, April 21<sup>st</sup> from 6pm to 8pm.** The last class will be on or about June 8<sup>th</sup>. To be eligible for the class, students must have their 15<sup>th</sup> birthday on or before November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2022. The cost of the class will be \$400, payable to Heritage Christian School, and due by the first day of class. You can bring payment to the parent meeting or pay in the school office at any time before class starts.

We plan to hold classes Monday through Thursday at Heritage from 6:30am to 8am while school is in session and then from 8am to 10am after school is out for the summer. Behind-the-Wheel instruction will be held from 3:30pm to 5:30pm while school is in session and then from 10am to 12pm and 12pm to 2pm after school is out for the summer. Each student will be required to attend one session (2 hours) of Behind the Wheel instruction for each section of class. That will usually amount to one session (2 hours) per week.
